Head Lice Treatment Instructions

Care of the student and family:

- 1. Treat all people living in the home with lice treatment on the same day. Follow the package directions carefully.
- 2. Don't use medications on children under two years of age or on pregnant or nursing mothers.
- 3. Don't treat an infested person more than three times with the same medication if it doesn't seem to work.
- 4. Don't mix head lice medications.
- 5. Don't use flammable or toxic substances, such as gasoline or kerosene. Products intended for animals should not be used to treat head lice in humans.
- 6. Remove dead lice and nits (eggs) from hair with a lice comb or with finger tips.
- 7. Repeat treatment in 7 days.

Care of clothing, personal items and the home:

- Wash all clothing and bed linens that have been used by the person in the past two days. Put pillows in a hot dryer for 30 minutes.
- 2. Vacuum all carpets and upholstered furniture. Dispose of the vacuum bag outside.
- 3. Seal stuffed animals and toys in a plastic bag for two weeks.
- 4. Don't use household pesticide sprays to rid lice in the home.

Parent/ Guardian responsibilities:

- 1. If your child is excluded from school, have them treated and returned to school in no longer than 48 hours.
- 2. Check your child and family frequently for head lice.
- 3. Carry out a recommended treatment of the child and home.
- 4. Encourage your child to not share combs, brushes, hats or other personal items that could carry lice.
- 5. Report all cases of head lice of your child to school.
