

Every year I teach students a lesson on the topic of bullying, as required by Indiana State Law. Bullying is a serious form of hurtful behavior that is done on purpose, repeated, and causes the child on the receiving end to feel fearful or worried.

Not all mean behaviors are bullying, however; here are three behaviors often confused with bullying:

- **Joking:** Everyone is having fun, but sometimes it can go too far.
- **Conflict:** Disagreement or argument between peers.
- **One Time Thing:** a hurtful behavior that occurs once or periodically, usually because of a strong reaction or feeling.

I will be teaching these lessons next week. Please encourage your child to tell you, as well as an adult at school, if they experience bullying behaviors. Our bullying policy is outlined in the student handbook.
